Judging Issues Through the First Five Shows of 2022

One advantage to being both VP of Judging and Chairman of Judges Training is that I can think deeply about what we are teaching our judges AND see if that material is being absorbed by the judges by reviewing the judging forms. I'd like to bring to your attention some of the items that we teach in both the basic Judging School and the Team Captain School that were

frequently missed through the first five events of this year.

First, we ask team captains to review the cars in their classes prior to the start of judging to make sure that they are in the correct class. Having a car incorrectly classified can create several issues. First, judges often ask for classes that they know well. If a car is classed incorrectly, the entire judging team may not know specifics about that vehicle to make appropriate deductions, giving the misclassed car a distinct advantage in the class. Second, after the event the staff and I need to review the records and move the cars to the appropriate class after the show. This can cause confusion with the owners who see that their class changed when they register for the next event. This issue is mainly affecting our factory

high performance classes and production vehicle class 27. Some examples are later model Camaro Z/28s and Buick Regal Grand Nationals being placed in Class 34 or 27 respectively instead of Class 36. Our judging system is one of our key values to our members and these two issues lead to a devaluing of that value.

Second, there are certain categories that require maximum deductions. Those categories are noted on the judging forms by a circled number. If the point number is circled on the judging form, you MUST take the maximum deduction. The most frequently misused maximum deduction is the upholstery. If the interior judge needs to take a deduction for a defect on the seat, that deduction should be taken under seat cushion or seat back. The upholstery deduction is a MAXIMUM deduction of 10 points for incorrect material. This was misused at least six times at the Charlotte Nationals alone.

As we move through the rest of our showing season, please keep these issues in mind. We do still have the best judging system in the car hobby and attention to these details allows us to maintain that leadership position.


Throughout the week of the show, we will be available in the Folder Distribution Tent on the Chocolate Field to answer any questions you might have. Please feel free to stop by and say hello!
