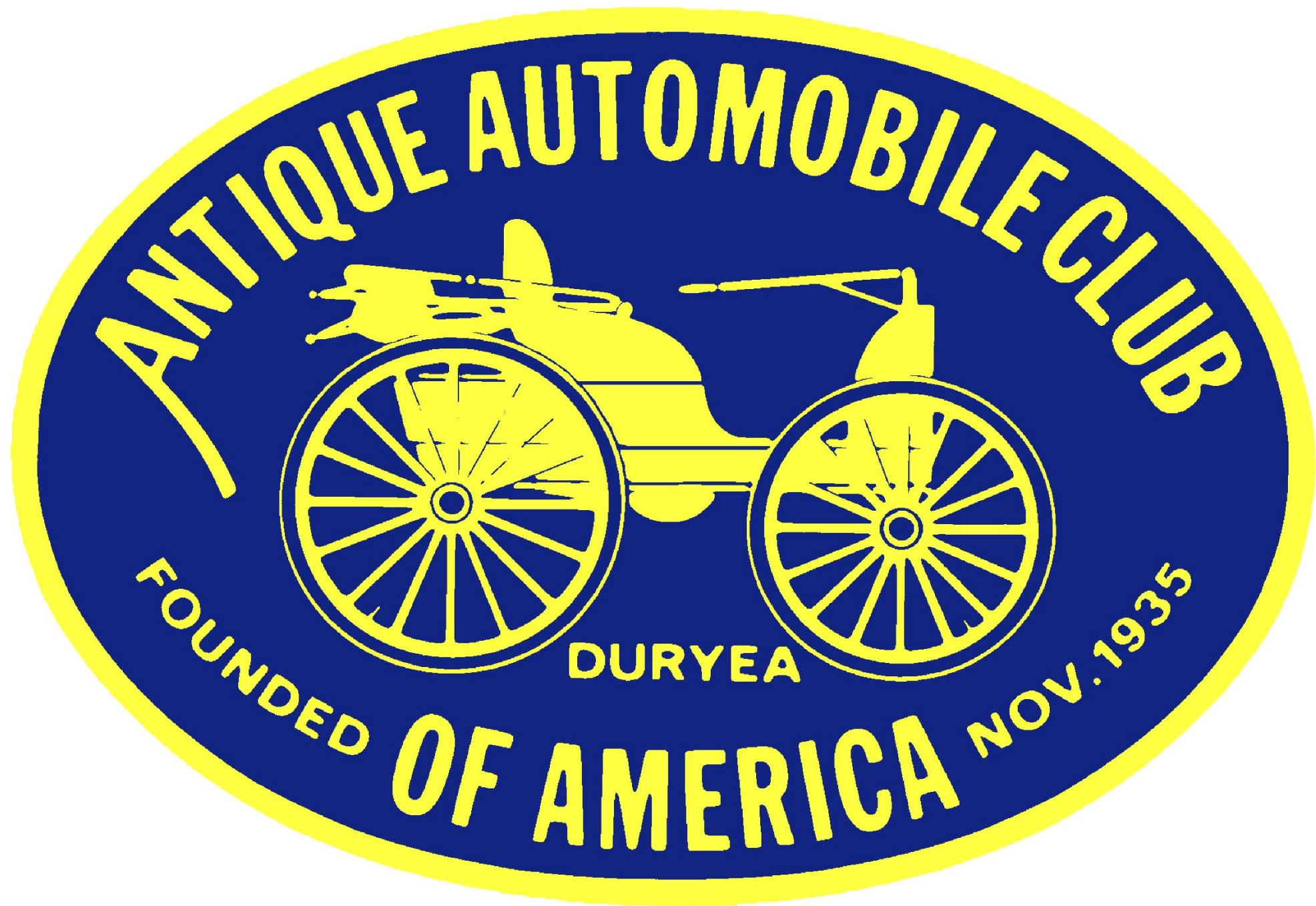

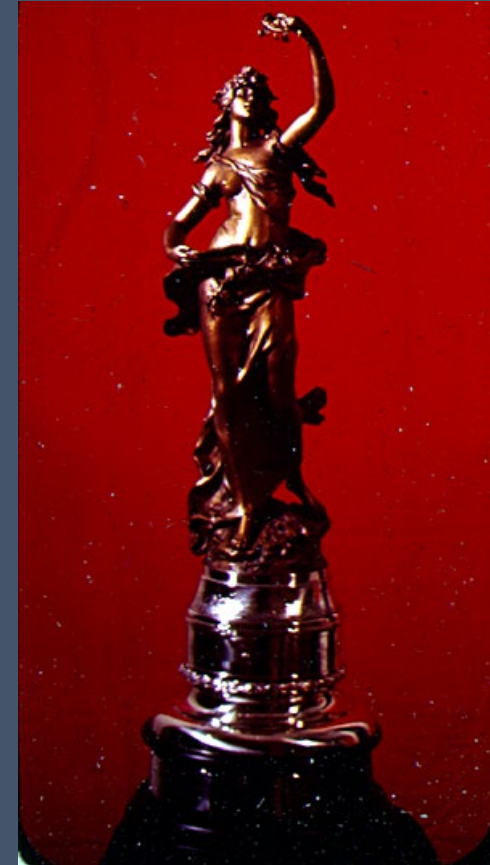
The Fiala Old Faithful Award Presented to Brenda Zimmerman

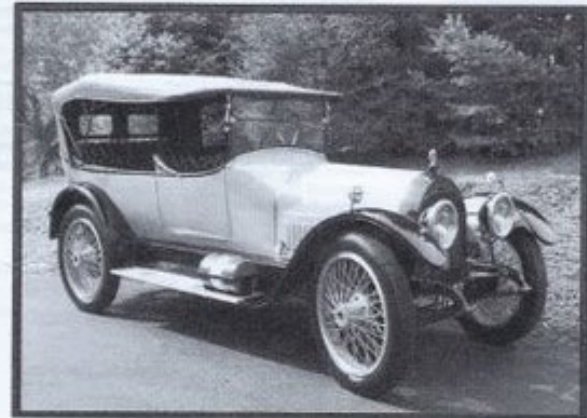

1966 Seagrave Fire Engine By Peter W. Pandolfi

The year was 1966. The Beatles were singing "Yellow Submarine" on the radio, TV shows Star Trek and Batman made their debuts, and Pampers disposable diapers were made available to the public. It was also a big year for the Town of Manassas, Virginia. Yes, I said town as Manassas did not become a city until 1973. As a town it operated under the auspices of Prince William County of which

Manassas was the county seat. Expanding its emergency services, the Greater Manassas Volunteer Rescue Squad was established with its station being build on Center St. near the courthouse on land donated by the Merchant family. The town purchased a 1966 International Harvester carry all ambulance, dubbed Creamy due to its color, which the Squad still owns to this day and brings to our annual Rohr car show. It was in this year that the County decided to put a 1966 Seagrave ladder truck on the west end of the County. The Manassas Volunteer Fire Company followed suit by retiring its 1939 Chevrolet fire engine for a 1966 Seagrave fire engine to match with the ladder truck. A little fire apparatus nomenclature: a fire engine is a vehicle that contains a water pump and usually a water tank, hose and one or two small ladders. A fire truck is a vehicle which carries an assortment of ladders, an aerial ladder (75 feet or over) and a wide range of tools used for ventilation and search and rescue.



Turns out my worries were needless. September 24th turned out to be a very nice day although it started out very chilly, especially in the Manchester area of Carroll County. We had a respectable turn out of 57 vehicles. A couple other car shows were reported to be in the vicinity.

There were several mid-1950s cars that you don't see much anymore. A pretty 1954 Oldsmobile '98' two-door Holiday hardtop, owned by Bernie Wentker. Very nice top-of-the-line white over reddish orange. I don't believe I ever saw this car before this day. Also present a 1957 Packard Clipper sedan in unbelievably pristine condition, white over metallic orchid. This car belonged to Hal Hermann. Yet another rarity was a 1954 Willys two-door hardtop model, Aero Eagle. In 1955 Willys re-named this model the Bermuda. The Willys is owned by Wayne Bollinger.

The car that won Best-Of-Show award was also a near mid-50s car, a 1953 DeSoto Firedome four door sedan. This car has been in the Baldino family ever since it was new when it was purchased by Rocco's grandfather in New York State. Rocco is a recent member of Chesapeake Region. Looking over this DeSoto is like walking back in history and looking at a DeSoto in the dealer's showroom. Everywhere you look, it is brand new. The engine bay doesn't show a hint of dirt or grease. The spacious trunk has a correct bias ply spare tire neatly tucked into it's place. The original looking trunk mat is spotless. Rocco is the owner and caretaker of this '53 DeSoto and he's doing a bang-up job.

Fifty awards were presented to 50 participants. Chesapeake Region also presented an award of appreciation to the Manchester Volunteer Fire Company and we presented Rocco Baldino the best-of-show award.

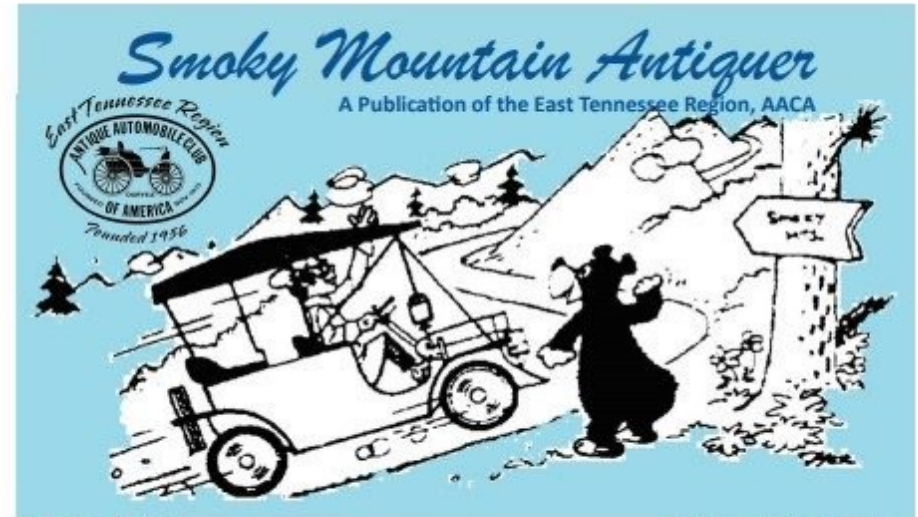

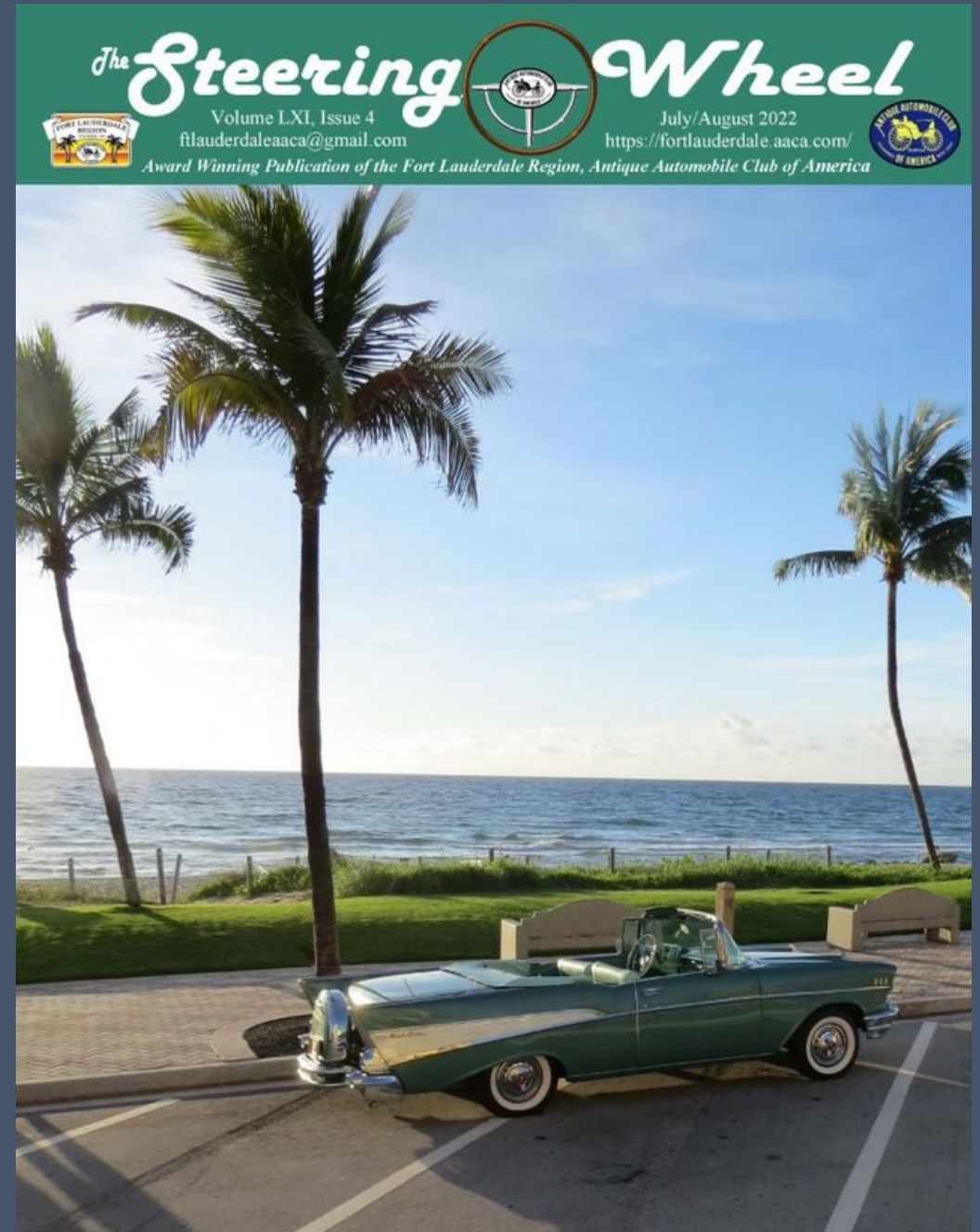

1951 Volkswagen Split Window

The Volkswagen Beetle is likely the most recognizable automobile on the planet. Not many people over the age of 30 haven't owned or at least ridden in one. I've heard it called the Model T of our time. The Volkswagen community is one of the best networked, brand specific, groups that I've been part of. If there is a Volkswagen Car Show, you can bet there will be parts for sale to keep your ride going.

There are several generations of Beetles. The basic groups are the Split Window, Oval Window, and everything else. Split Window's were built from 1939 till 1951. The Oval Window was built from 1953 till 1957. In all, over 21 million were built from 1938 till 2003.

This 1951 Volkswagen Beetle is a Deluxe Sedan split-window body finished in Chestnut Brown over a cream

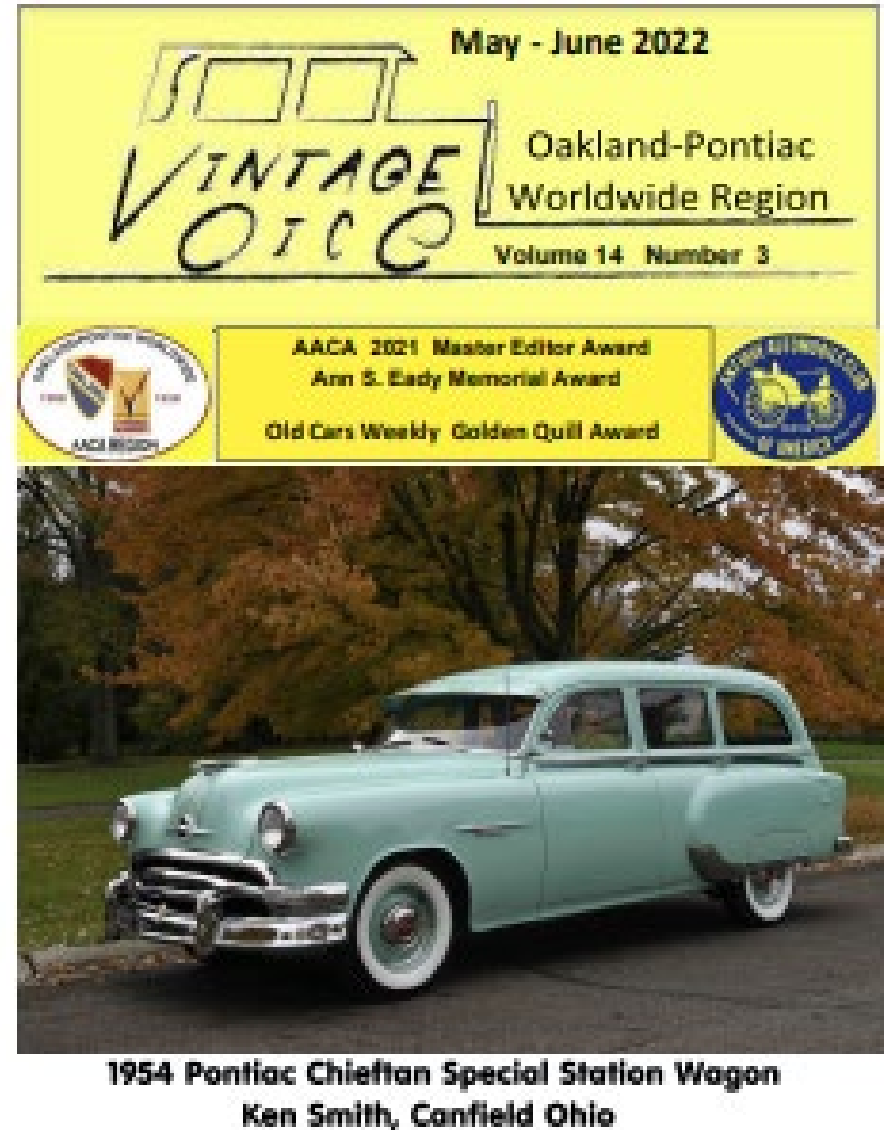

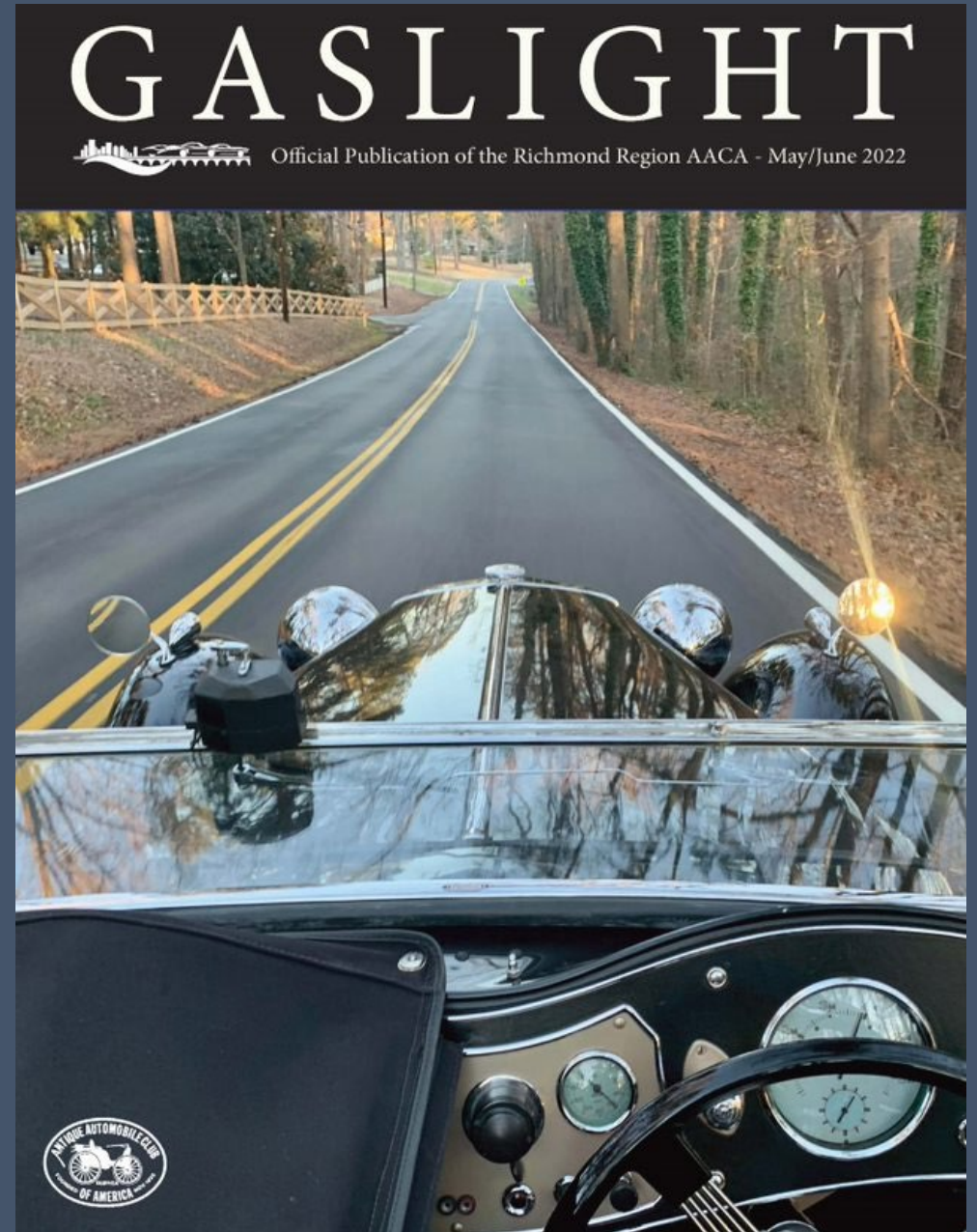

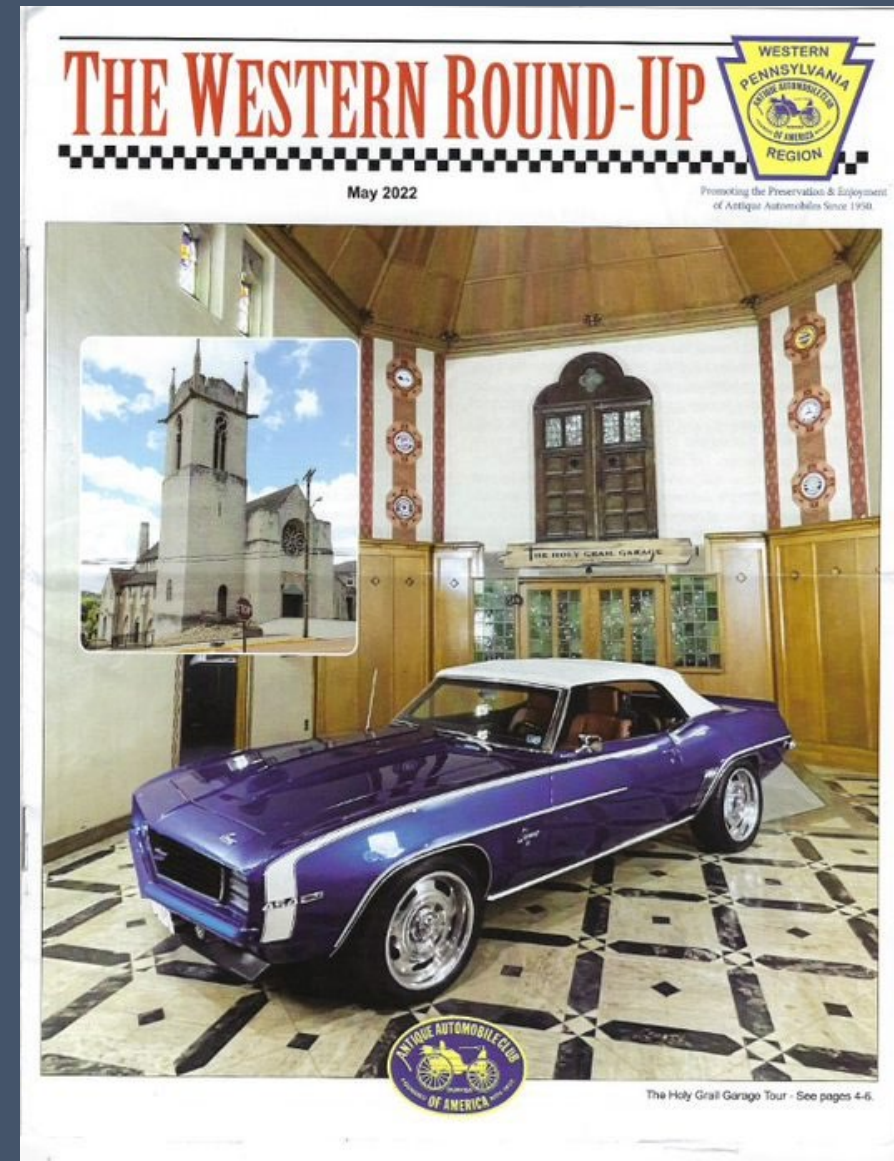
Now in 2018, two years later, the truck was still there with the same selling price of \$3000. I just couldnot resist and offered them \$1500, but "No deal". (Con't on Page
