

Awarded at the annual meeting to an individual or region in recognition of their outstanding contributions in hosting a Divisional Tour.




The Winters Racing Award Tommy Nolen

Chris Ritter AACA Library & Research Center Award Charles Gibson


Awarded annually to the person who made an outstanding contribution of any kind (personal service, financial support or other aid) to the AACA Library and Research Center.



Car of the Month 1973 AMC Javelin AMX

My first memory of working on cars was with my father, growing up in Staunton, VA. He would let me help change the oil in his cars, but that was about the extent of it. I have always been drawn to mechanical things, curious about how they work and rewarded when I can figure out how to fix them.

When I was in sophomore in high school, I had my first experience working on an older/antique car. First was a 1967 Ford Mustang. A friend of my bought the mustang to fix up. Luckily the engine was in good shape, and all was needed was a tune up. This was the first time I really got my hands dirty working on cars. My most vivid memory was installing a toggle switch on the dash to operate the back-up lights, so it would pass state inspection. Back then you stayed in the car during the inspection, and my friend operated the back-up light with the toggle when the inspector asked him to put it in reverse - the Mustang passed inspection.








My blue Mercedes is a 1959 300d Adenauer, the little'd' indicates a fourth series car, not to be confused with the big 'D' used for disels. The 300 Mercedes ran from 1951 to 1962 in four series, the last 'd' (like mine) was the first 4 door cars with standard fuel injection! This system evolved from the system introduced on the 300SL Gullwing sports car in 1955. I bought mine in 2000 as a 30th birthday present for myself. It is one of 2 300ds this color and the only civilian car equipped with the parade horns mounted above the front bumper. Many 300ds were used by various governments and some of these feature them. My car is also one of the first Mercedes sold with Air Conditioning! All 300s feature an overhead cam engine, 4 wheel independent suspension, and load leveling in the back. My car additionally features power steering, brakes and and automatic transmission. It was about \$13,500 new.
