And Chatham Manor



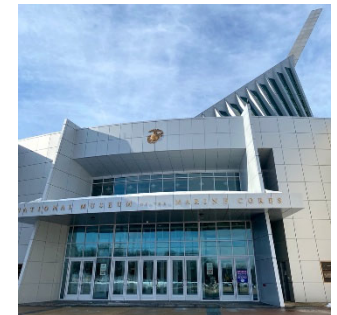
