




Presented to 2024 Glidden Tour - Sugarloaf Mountain Region AACA - Rob Burchill, Chairman

Chris Ritter AACA Library & Research Center Award Presented to Amoi Goldman


Awarded annually to the person who made an outstanding contribution of any kind (personal service, financial support or other aid) to the AACA Library and Research Center.
